Notes:

- 1) This document can be signed by any “Member of Police” (s 43A (1)(b)), not just an Arms Officer.
- 2) The fact that a person is the holder of current firearms licence is sufficient evidence of their fit and proper status to possess firearms and ammunition pursuant to s 20 (1) of the Arms Act 1983. If not, then s 27 (1) should be commenced forthwith.
- 3) If the above conditions are met it is unlawful and a breach of statutory duty for a “Member of Police” to a) impose further requirements or conditions not specified in s 43 A; and b) refuse to endorse this form for any other reason than i) the licence not being valid or expired; or ii) the person is not a fit and proper person.
- 4) It is not a lawful requirement that this mail order form is on a form “provided by the police”.
- 5) This form does not apply to pistols, restricted weapons or MSSA’s (s 43A (2)).
- 6) This form applies to standard firearms only and all ammunition.
- 7) No mail order form is required from the purchaser of air guns or soft air (airsoft) guns, however the seller must take reasonable steps to ensure that the purchaser is over the age of 18 years.
